Dear VSU Parent

It is a new year, and once again a new semester has begun at Valdosta State University. We are experiencing many changes in our Housing and Residence Life department, perhaps similar to the growing pains that your student has experienced.

Your student has likely changed quite a bit during this past semester, especially if he or she is a freshman. Maybe your son is sporting a goatee or your daughter has an extra piercing in her ear. Maybe you are noticing the multiple daily phone calls have been reduced to once a day! Your student is likely becoming more at ease with making his or her own decisions. These changes often take time to get used to, but hopefully they will prove beneficial in the long run.

Coincidentally, our department is undergoing something similar. Part of our mission is to house 25 percent of all undergraduate students by the year 2014. More than 11,000 students are currently enrolled at VSU, and the university projects enrollment to reach 16,400 students by 2014. For us to accommodate this influx, VSU must build additional state of the art residence halls to house at least 4,100 students.



Choices for 2009-2010 for Upper-class Students

This year we are able to offer more living accommodations with more amenities than ever before for our upperclassmen. They are able to choose from Centennial, Converse and Hopper halls. Centennial and Converse offer apartment-style units that house two or four students, with 12 month contracts. Hopper hall is an all suite style building with private and semi-private accommodations. This is a nine-month contract option.

Students who currently live in Centennial and Converse hall will be able to reclaim their space if certain criteria are met. Please see the reclaim section for more details. This process will be held two weeks before room selection. If students reclaim the same space, they will not participate in room selection.

Returning students will be given preference in the following order during room selection: current juniors

and above (rising seniors or graduate students), then sophomores (rising juniors), and finally current freshman (rising sophomores). The exact time to claim a room is further broken down by cumulative GPA.

Yes, your student is undergoing changes, and so is VSU Housing. I am confident that these growing pains will make for a brighter future for all of us.

More Space with More Options for Returning Students

Upperclassmen are able to choose among **Centennial, Converse and Hopper** for the 2009-2010 academic year.

Centennial Hall is our 520-bed facility that features individual bedrooms, a kitchen shared by no more than four residents, one to two bathrooms, and a dining/living room area. Centennial is conveniently located next to the Student Recreation Center and the Sustella parking deck, giving upperclassman some much needed privacy and convenience. Centennial has trained staff support to program and provide emergency assistance as needed.

Converse Hall is our original apartment community. A small facility with only 100 beds, Converse is ideally located in the center of campus. The hall has two varieties of apartments — efficiency units, which house one resident and traditional one-bedroom apartments, which house two residents.

Both halls are on a **12-month Contract (August – July)**.

Hopper Hall is our new suite-style hall and will provide two private bedrooms with a shared bathroom or two semi-private rooms (two beds in each bedroom) with a shared bathroom. Hopper is on a nine-month contract system (August — May).

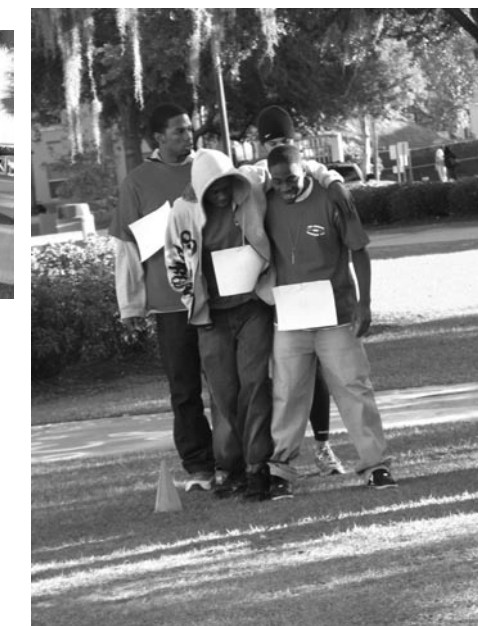

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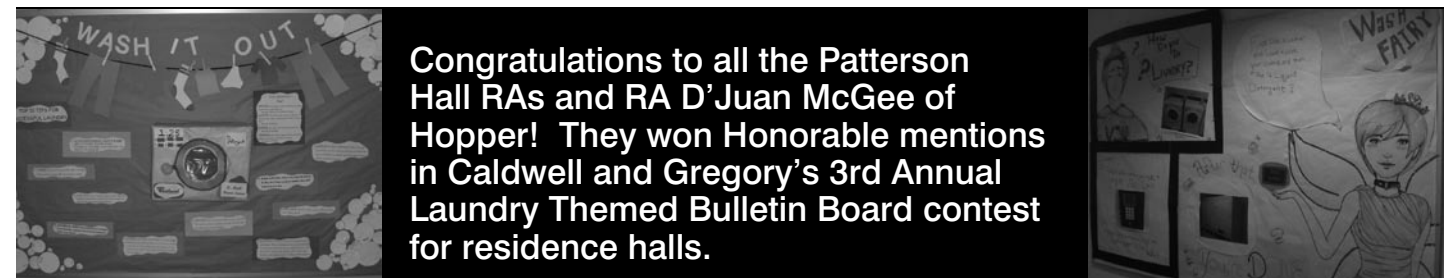
Awards and Honors

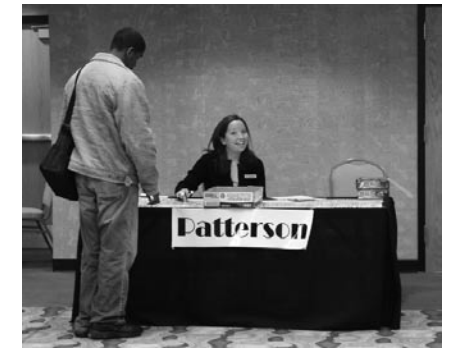

**Reclaim process -
February 16 – 17, 2009**

Students who currently live in Centennial hall will be able to reclaim the space if both students in the two bedroom or two out of the four current students in the four person apartments want to reclaim it. Students in Converse will be able to reclaim their apartment if they live in an efficiency by themselves or if both students in a one bedroom wish to reclaim. This process will be held the two weeks before room selection. If students reclaim their same space, they will not be eligible to attend room selection. Students who are not able to reclaim or do not wish to reclaim their same space may attend room selection and receive a new housing space for Fall 2009. All students in apartments who are not assigned to the same unit for 2009-2010 must move out of their current room assignment at the end of the contract period, which is August 1, 2009 for cleaning and maintenance purposes. All returning students are permitted to move into their new assignment on August 14, 2009 — move-in day for upperclassmen.

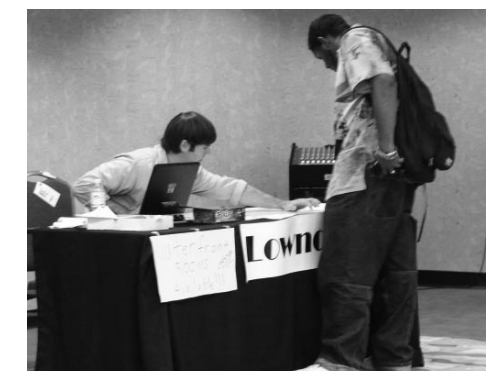
Students assigned to the same apartment for 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 will not be asked to move out August 1. They may stay during the two-week interim period between contracts.

The reclaim process will be held in the Centennial Hall classroom on Monday, February 16, 3:00 P.M. – 8:00 P.M. and Tuesday, February 17, 9:00 A.M. – 3:00 P.M.

**On Campus Room Selection Process -
March 2 – 4, 2009**

From March 2-4, 2009, we will hold our annual room selection process. Each student will be allowed to participate based on the number of credit hours completed and GPA. Current residence hall students who wish to room together will be able to bring their preferred roommate with them to room selection if the students has the same credit hour designation. (For example: Both or all of the students who wish to room together will need to have completed 21 credit hours or less, 22-59 credit hours, or 60 credit hours or more/graduate student).

Students who are not in the same credit hour designation will not be permitted to come to room selection together. Please note that Housing holds the largest number of spaces to house freshmen and sophomores due to socialization, academic success and personal growth needs. On his or her assigned date and time, your student simply needs to report to the University Center – Cypress Room to sign up for a space on campus. If your student plans to live on campus for the 2009–2010 academic school year, he or she may attend one of the meetings about the process held in the residence halls February 23–26, 2009. Wait List Process (Please read this carefully)

Because of the limited space for returning students, please be aware that not all returning students are guaranteed to receive a space on campus during the room selection process. If your student does not receive a space, they will have the opportunity to be placed on the returning student wait list. The wait list is for the first available space, not a particular residence hall. Students placed on the wait list will be able to find out their status beginning Monday, March 9; however, Housing will work until the August opening to fill all spaces for students on the wait list who still desire a placement for the 2009-2010 academic year. Note that the wait list numbers are based on a weighted average of housing more sophomores, then juniors, then seniors and graduate students. There is no guarantee that being on a wait list will ultimately result in an offer to move in. Priority for vacant upper-class spaces is given to residents remaining from the March 2009 wait list sign-up. Wait list room offers

will be made via phone call and/or e-mail sent to your student's valdosta.edu e-mail address. Students will have only 24 hours to accept an offer from the time it is sent, so please make sure your student reviews his or her messages and/or e-mail frequently. If a student declines a space offered, he or she will not be able to remain on the wait list.

Summer School Housing Sign-up

Students living on campus in a traditional style residence hall will have a special application period for summer 2009. The summer application process will be held April 6 through April 8. Students simply need to come by our office to submit their applications and contracts. Please visit our Web site for more information.
